Theory of solar cells

The theory of solar cells explains the process by which light energy in photons is converted into electric current when the photons strike a suitable semiconductor device. The theoretical studies are of practical use because they predict the fundamental limits of a solar cell, and give guidance on the phenomena that contribute to losses and solar cell efficiency.

What is Solar Cell (or Photovoltaic Cell)? Working, Circuit Diagram

A solar cell or photovoltaic cell is a semiconductor PN junction device with no direct supply across the junction. It transforms the light or photon energy incident on it into electrical

How Do Solar Panels Work? (Details Explained + Diagrams)

Solar panels are composed of many smaller photovoltaic cells, and each cell is essentially a sandwich of semiconductor panels. This multitude of PV cells makes up a solar panel. Sunlight is composed of photons, and when they strike the PV cells, the photons knock electrons loose from atoms, which creates the flow of electricity.

In a nutshell, solar panels generate electricity when photons (those particles of sunlight we discussed before) strike solar cells. The process is called the photovoltaic effect. First discovered in 1839 by Edmond Becquerel, the photovoltaic effect is characteristic of certain materials (known as semiconductors) that allows them to generate an electrical current when ...

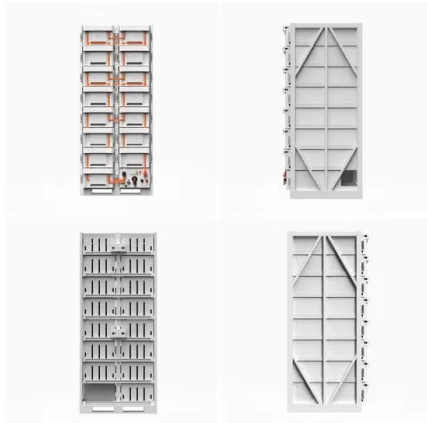

The Working Principle of a Solar Cell

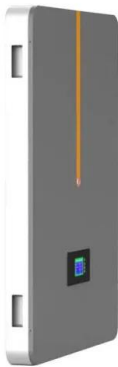

Equivalent Circuit of Solar Cell

The equivalent circuit of a solar cell consists of an ideal current generator in parallel with a diode in reverse bias, both of which are connected to a load. 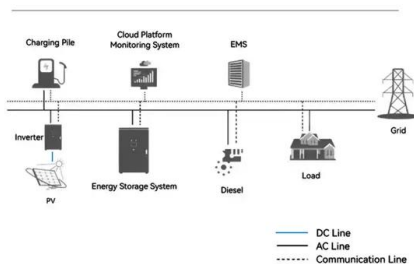

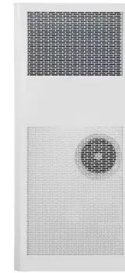
