Overview

Should kids learn about the Solar System?

The Solar system is a great place for kids to start learning about the universe. But reading about it can be overwhelming. There is so much information about the Solar system for kids but a lot of it is written using advanced terms and doesn't completely answer their questions.

Why are the first 4 planets a terrestrial planet?

The order and arrangement of the planets and other bodies in our solar system is due to the way the solar system formed. Nearest to the Sun, only rocky material could withstand the heat when the solar system was young. For this reason, the first four planets – Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars – are terrestrial planets.

Which of the following is the largest member of the Solar System?

Apart from the Sun, the largest members of the Solar System are the eight major planets. Nearest the Sun are four fairly small, rocky planets - Mercury, Venus, Earth and Mars. Beyond Mars is the asteroid belt – a region populated by millions of rocky objects. These are left-overs from the formation of the planets, 4.5 billion years ago.

What is a planetary system?

The solar system is also known as a planetary system. Since the 1990s scientists have found many planetary systems beyond our solar system. In these systems, one or more planets orbit a star—just as the eight planets in our solar system orbit the Sun. These planets are called extrasolar planets.

What makes up the Solar System?

This is where we call “home.” The solar system is made up of some major and minor players, all of which interact with each other. The solar system consists of our sun, which is a star, and all that its gravity affects. The planets in our



solar system are Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune.

What is a solar system and why is it important?

That is the Solar system. The Solar system is a group of planets, asteroids, comets, and other things that orbit around the Sun. Think about it as our local neighborhood. Mars, Venus, Jupiter, and the other planets are our close neighbors. The Sun is at the center of the Solar system.



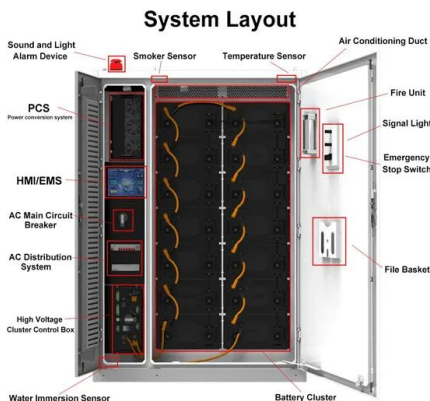

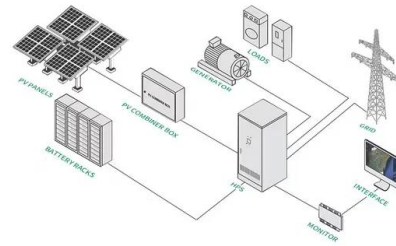
